Peepholes are considered essential, inexpensive, and durable safety hardware.' I appreciate that. You filled out the application for me on 1/15/26 (I thanked you for it), and I was able to get the parking placard. I agree and appreciate what you say about the life alert system. That does not negate the fact that an intercom system and a tandem parking stall aka accessible parking stall have a purpose. State Law (as well as the federal ADA to some degree) has determined that an intercom system from front door to unit, as well as an accessible parking stall, are accessibility requirements for the public as well as tenants in private apartment buildings as well as government buildings. There are too many cooks in the kitchen. To update, the housing provider is still refusing to make my intercom operational and he is still refusing me a handicapped accessible parking stall that is closest to the accessible route of the building. He is agreeable to provide a wheelchair height door peephole that I can see both ends of hallway but wants a doctor note on this.

Hello Geary, I have no problem filling out a permanent parking permit application for you . You need to obtain it from the DMV in person or from their website. Fill out your portion, drivers license, car details , personal info and send it to the business office and they will create a digital form for me to fill out. The intercom system which I assume for the house does not make sense. If you were to fall at home and needed assistance from someone in the house just by yelling for help anything living or staying at that home

would hear the call for help unless you were in a house > 4000 square feet. If that other person was not there at that instant your yelling or even if you had such an intercom system would not help you at all. Much better is to purchase a Life Alert system worn around the neck or your wrist. If you call and no one is present you would alert the fire house nearby or police and you would get immediate attention even if no one is in the house other than yourself.

That is what almost all do especially if living alone.
