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MEMORIALIZATION OF CALL SESSION

I talked with ADRIANA DUARTE RN at Kaiser Primary care Plus by phone March 2. I repeated to her some of the ailments that I am being treated for, as well as [REDACTED]

We questioned how Dr. Pathak arrived at the antibiotic prescribed October

30, 2025 being that there was no urine culture taken. I still request that a blood culture be done. I continue to request the doctors Siegel and Pathak, ET AL. participate in the Kaiser process for me to get a letter requesting reasonable housing accommodation. An intercom system for my use as a tenant is considered to be an accessibility requirement ---by state and local building code law---and so is handicapped parking and accessible wheelchair height peephole. The letters I attach occurred before the handicapped placard was issued. A handicapped parking stall is needed near the rear door where there is one step because I cannot navigate a walker or wheelchair up the eight front steps. The parking placard is further proof of need for intercom. Kaiser doctors could easily recommend an accessible intercom system and indoor unit interface/monitor; doctors could easily recommend a wheelchair height accessible unit door peephole, doctors could easily recommend a handicapped parking stall for my housing locations. I believe that the requirement/recommendation is not being made due to racial bias, or other unlawful bias, medical incompetence, or a combination.

I feel any doctor who cannot identify my ailments to the Kaiser Medical Records is not qualified.

1. Frequently during the day, [REDACTED] day. Unpredictable. Was this addressed by Adriana? No.
2. We talked about possibility of home health aide. I told her I will get back to her on this because I have to check what hours will work so my [REDACTED] not disturbed. Also I need to get the intercom system functioning in my unit and get a unit wheelchair accessible peephole, to properly accommodate the home health care aide onto the premises.

There was no discussion of this by Adriana. Could this be caused by PAD? Could this [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] No word from Adriana on this.
4. Adriana made no comment on my continuing request for a letter from a Kaiser Doctor etc. verifying my medical symptoms and requesting a letter stating request for reasonable housing accommodation. Who are the Medical Professionals Who Can Write a Reasonable Housing Accommodation Letter? (Taken from Google AI.) Under U.S. Fair Housing laws, a letter verifying the need for a reasonable accommodation can be written by a licensed health care or related

professional who is familiar with the patient's condition and its impact on their housing needs. This can include:

- Physicians (including specialists such as psychiatrists)
- Psychologists
- Nurse practitioners or registered nurses
- Licensed clinical social workers (LCSWs)
- Occupational therapists
- Physical therapists
- Speech-language pathologists
- Vocational rehabilitation specialists
- Licensed mental health counselors or therapists

The key requirement is that the professional must be qualified to diagnose or confirm the disability and explain how the requested accommodation is necessary for the patient to fully use and enjoy their housing.

Apparently there is no employee qualified at Kaiser Permanente West Los Angeles to diagnose or confirm my disability for purposes of a letter requesting a reasonable housing accommodation.

Today I talked with the Kaiser social worker. I expressed my continuing concerns over my request for letters requesting a reasonable housing accommodation. Various doctors have said let the other doctor do it, so that is why I have contacted multiple doctors. The letter from Dr. Thippenvong, as I expressed, is not complete enough because it does not address the need for tandem parking, the need for handicapped parking stall, and need for unit door accessible peephole. The social worker asked if I could see thru



' What is the definition of a wheelchair under the ADA? A wheelchair is a manually operated or power-driven device designed primarily for use by an individual with a mobility disability for the main purpose of indoor, or of both indoor and outdoor, locomotion. Individuals with mobility disabilities must be permitted to use wheelchairs and manually powered mobility aids, i.e., walkers, crutches, canes, braces, or other similar devices designed for use by individuals with mobility disabilities, in any areas open to pedestrian traffic.' Attached is a copy of the wheelchair approval which I believe originated from the Neurology department. The Doctor wheelchair order is the medical justification for the wheelchair accessible unit door peephole.

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
